In his holy flirtation with the world, God occasionally drops a handkerchief.


These handkerchiefs are called saints.

SALEM OBSERVES OPIOID AWARENESS SUNDAY

Delaware-Maryland Synod designated October 14 as Opioid Awareness Sunday, encouraging congregations to focus in helpful fashion on this national epidemic.

In our worship that weekend, Pastor Ed and Vicky Whetstone preached the sermon. Portions of the worship were drawn from resources provided by the synod's Opioid Awareness Task Force, of which Vicky is a member. They were chosen as this crisis is of great concern to them, opioid abuse and recovery having had a significant impact on their family.

Our adult forums on October 14 and 21 were dedicated to this topic. On October 14, Linsey Martindale (the Whetstone's daughter) spoke to sixty or so of our members in Reformation Hall, giving the addict's perspective. After many years of addiction, Linsey has now been clean for several years. On the 21st, the Whetstones provided the family perspective. Both perspectives were intended to bring hope and strength to those dealing with addiction.

In their presentations both Linsey and her parents strongly recommended the benefits of the twelvestep programs and meetings of Narcotics Anonymous for addicts, and Nar Anon for family members. Both groups provide life-saving support and ready access to many helpful resources.

A few statistics verify opioid abuse as a national epidemic. One in seven Americans will experience opioid addiction, only 10% of whom will receive treatment. Opioid abuse is now the leading cause of death for persons under the age of fifty. Every 19 minutes an American dies from an opioid or heroin overdose.

Pastor Ed and Vicky encourage those who have such a concern, for themselves or loved ones, to feel free to speak to them.



CHRISTMAS-AT-SEA PROJECT

At this very moment, 166 colorfully wrapped shoeboxes are sailing the high seas, stashed away in the captains' quarters aboard ships bound for destinations halfway around the world. These gifts will be distributed on Christmas Eve as crewmembers far from home celebrate the birth of our Savior.

Thrice-blessed at Salem, these boxes, part of the Christmas-at-Sea project, were lovingly packed by members of the Salem Stitchcrafters on October 18 in Reformation Hall. Members of the group, which meets most every Thursday at 10 a.m. in the Wittenberg Room, worked for the better part of the year to make this day possible. Hand-knitted and crocheted hats and scarves and hand-written greetings were tucked inside the shoeboxes, which were generously donated by well-shod members of Salem and the community.

Augmented by a Thrivent Action Team grant of \$250 and the generosity of others, puzzle books, lip balm, soap, pens, socks, and gloves were also included, as well as a copy of the New Testament, purchased from funds made available by Salem.

After two hours of organizing, packing, and wrapping, the Stitchcrafters refueled at Panera Bread, where they discussed ongoing and future projects.

Salem Stitchcrafters have regularly met for more than 20 years and continue to identify new ways to share their time and talents. The group is open to all. (more pictures on page 13.)

- After a presentation by Amy Pflug and the Technology Committee, a motion was passed to spend \$10,730 for an updated and improved sound system for the church nave. Preliminary work began on the budget which will tentatively include a 2% COL for the church staff.

ANNUAL BUDGET MEETING

The Annual Meeting to adopt the 2019 church budget and vote on spending \$10,370 on an updated sound system will be held on December 8 and December 9 before all worship services. Members of the congregation will receive a copy of the draft budget and an explanation of the sound system proposal in the mail.

THRIVENT ACTION TEAM GRANTS


What if you could direct an additional \$500 every year to a charitable undertaking at Salem without leaving your home, making a phone call, or attending a meeting?

As it turns out, members of Thrivent Financial are able to do just that, thanks to Action Team grants. Grants of \$250 each may be obtained twice in a calendar year by every member, using an online process that takes less than an hour. There is an instructional video that walks applicants through the process, in addition to Thrivent members in the congregation who have expressed their willingness to assist others.

Who has benefited from this program? To name just a few: The Salem Stitchcrafters and the quilting group have secured these funds for purchasing, among other things, yarn and batting. The Refugee Task Force and Salem's Youth gGroup have also taken advantage of this source of money. And, for several years, the Salem Marketplace has received grants that pay for all the ingredients for lunch.

Because of privacy laws, however, there is no way for groups within the congregation that could benefit from this financial boost to connect with those who are eligible to apply. To this end, it has been suggested that someone volunteer to serve as a Thrivent Action Team Coordinator. Ideally, a list of Thrivent members would be compiled and then matched with projects. Volunteers, anyone? Please contact Pastor Dave if you would be willing to take on this job.




Soon, Hal finds herself at the funeral of the deceased...where it dawns on her that there is something very, very wrong about this strange situation and the inheritance at the center of it.

Big Little Lies is a brilliant take on ex-husbands and second wives, mothers and daughters, schoolyard scandal, and the little lies that can turn lethal.


FREE RIDE


