

NOTES FROM THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY

End-of-year 2021 Financial Statements were distributed at church in late January/early February. A separate statement was included that shows your 2022 pledge information, if your pledge form was received before the statements were printed. Statements are always provided at the end of the third quarter and at the end of the year, but you may request one at any time.

The last two years have seen a sharp increase in the number of online donations. During that time the number of households giving online has increased from 40 to 63. Also, online giving as a percentage of total giving has increased from 23% to 38%. Online giving provides a more consistent income stream for Salem's work and has a bonus advantage of decreasing the tellers' workload. Online givers can contribute to the General Fund and all of our special collections (2nd Coat, CEA, LDR, Easter, Christmas, etc.). They can make one-time donations to any of these or set up ongoing donations at any interval (weekly, monthly, quarterly, etc.). Sign up forms are available or you may create an online account from the Donate Now tab on Salem's webpage.

Each year we have to do some shuffling of Giver numbers and yours may have changed between 2021 and 2022. Your end-of-year 2021 Financial Statement has your **new 2022 number**, so please take a look at that. If you ever use a green pew envelope, please add your Giver number, if possible, otherwise just put your name and leave the envelope number blank; the tellers will look it up and make sure the correct one is used. (**Fun Fact:** Everyone has a Giver number whether they use the preprinted envelopes or not.)

Lastly, if there is anyone who **doesn't** have preprinted envelopes and wants them, please let me know and we will get them to you. Likewise, if anyone has preprinted envelopes but doesn't think they use them enough to warrant the cost, also let me know.

- Approved a motion to change the \$10,000 limit in the Constitution for Council expenditures to 3.5% of the annual budget which would be about \$20,500. This motion will also be presented to the Congregation for their approval at a special Congregation Meeting on March 26-27.

Our youth group has sold mulch for many years now at Salem with a huge amount of support from our congregation and their friends. Please know that your youth group and their leaders appreciate greatly all that support given them in the past and look forward to your support in future endeavors.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Weekly Sunday school has begun again! We kicked off our "Reconnecting" theme on Sunday, February 13. On the following Sundays in February, we "Praised God" thanking Him for His awesome creations and then continued on the last Sunday in February to learn about "The Burning Bush".

SALEM PARKING LOT CLOSURE

You'll find the Frederick Road entrance to Salem's parking lot closed during the week. It will be open before worship on Saturday afternoon and remain open until after worship on Sunday afternoon. The purpose of the closure during the week is to prevent unwanted pass-throughs or drive-throughs. Unfortunately a goodly number of drivers have been using our parking lot as a road and racing through our lot to cut off the corner at Newburg and Frederick Road. It is a safety issue that we are addressing by closing this entrance. For many years this entrance was open only on Sunday morning but an agreement with the bank in the 1990s opened up the entrance to provide their customers easier access to the bank and the ATM. Now that the BB&T branch has permanently closed the Property Committee has moved to close the entrance during the week.

German boy.


Ludwig is an odd and introverted child, growing up in Hitler's Germany. While Ludwig's father, Wilhelm, is a senior Nazi and a true believer, Ludwig escapes the unfolding catastrophe by withdrawing into nature and books. Eventually, when the Allied bombing campaign intensifies, Ludwig is sent to a Hitler Youth camp, where his oddness makes him a target for bullying.

As the war turns against Germany, the Hitler Youth camp becomes ever more severe and militaristic, and the atmosphere spirals towards chaos. After the Nazis abandon the camp, Ludwig returns home, and his father is presumed dead. With Ludwig's mother descending into depression, the 11-year-old bears increasing responsibility for the survival of the family as starvation sets in under Russian occupation. Soon, it will be impossible to leave the Russian zone, so Ludwig decides that he must rally his despondent mother and lead her.

Based on a true story, *The Willow Wren* is a unique, touching exploration of extremism, resilience, and the triumph of the small.

WE'RE READY TO WELCOME A NEWLY ARRIVED AFGHAN REFUGEE FAMILY TO AMERICA!!

On March 14 we will welcome a family of four from Afghanistan into their new home.

Our moving date is **Saturday, March 12** and we thank all those who have signed up and donated furniture, household goods, and food. Please only contribute items requested, and use the Signup Genius when you do. Gift cards to Shoppers, Safeway, and Giant will help them to buy perishables and other needed things.

Your financial support for the Refugee Fund is also critical. We will be paying their rent the first three months, then tapering that assistance across the following nine months. There are legal fees and other expenses which will occur before they're able to fully support themselves.

And there will be much to do after they arrive here. We will welcome leads for Masooma's employment and assistance in their orientation and language skills, among other things.

Please keep them in your prayers. And please pray and advocate for the 85 million forcibly displaced people in the world.

- Another Villager who has been unhoused for ten years has received housing offers and is choosing which apartment will suit them best
- Two people started working on their G.E.D.
- Two leaders of NAM joined Turnaround Tuesdays, an employment and leadership program, with others coming behind them.

SALEM VOLUNTEERS SERVE THE CHILDREN'S HOME

The Children's Home has its campus on Bloomsbury Ave. in Catonsville, and will celebrate 160 years of service in 2023. Their mission is to serve at-risk youth, offering a variety of mental health services to address the effects of childhood trauma. When Pastor Dave Asendorf reached out to them last year to ask how Salem could support their vital work, their most urgent need was volunteers to pick up food donations from the Catonsville Chick-Fil-A three times a week and deliver them to the Children's Home kitchen. Their staff provides about 160 meals per day to residents and staff, so these donations make a huge difference.

Since November 1, 2021, a dedicated group of Salem volunteers has met this need:

Carolyn Moore, Kathie Zink, Brenda Hurbanis, Anne Thiessan, Tim Van Sant, Rob Portman, Treen Null, and Joey Morgan. Nancy Asendorf and Mary Ann and Earl Ruley serve as substitutes.

Recently, Christy Page, the Director of Community Engagement for The Children's Home shared, "This group has been a blessing. The Facilities and Kitchen staff have been so grateful for their support, and that this has happened so seamlessly has saved us substantial staffing hours. This is a significant gift that lets

our staff focus on directly serving the kids in our care. We are so grateful."

The impact of service goes both ways. Explaining his commitment, Joey Morgan said, "I think it's really amazing what the Children's Home does for the kids there. These kids have back stories that most people have never been through or could understand. Having been in a tough situation myself growing up, I get it."

<u>Volunteer Needed</u>: A couple of our team members will need to step down soon, so beginning on March 30, a new volunteer is needed to serve every other Wednesday, from about 10-11 a.m. It involves loading and carrying 6-8 bags of frozen food (max weight 15-20 pounds each). Freezer bags are provided.

HISTORICAL OLD SALEM NEWS

Finally, after almost two years of not being able to get together as a group, the Old Salem Board of Directors met in February to plan our 2022 Calendar of Events. We are very excited and hoping that we again will be able to host programs at Old Salem itself (located at 701 Ingleside Avenue) as well as take some long awaited day bus trips.

Our first event will be an Outdoor Craft Fair/Yard Sale event in Salem's parking lot. The event is scheduled for **Saturday, May 7, from 8 a.m. to noon** with a **rain date of Saturday, May 21**. 
