Please note that this is not to be considered tax advice. Consult a certified tax consultant to ensure that you meet all requirements.

For those who are at least 70½ years old, you can send money from your taxable investments, i.e., 401K or IRA, to a not-for-profit organization and not pay taxes on those distributions. And, if you are required to make a required minimum distribution (RMD), this donation can be part of your RMD.

Also, if you own stocks, you may transfer stocks to Salem and not pay capital gains tax on the sale of the stocks.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

Almost three years ago, we began using the Nave to record and, now, livestream worship services. Last year, an average of 70 people watched our services each week. Not surprisingly, the lighting in the Nave had not been designed for video. Some areas, such as where the Saturday Singers stand, were relatively dark and in the chancel, the pastors were in front of the brightly lit mosaics. The temporary theatrical lights helped but were not adequate. Paul Timmel designed improved lighting and, with the help of Matt Medicus and Duane Linsenbardt, has installed the new lights. Look for improved live-streaming in the very near future

CHILDREN'S HOME FOOD DELIVERY VOLUNTEER

Every Monday, Wednesday and Friday since November, 2021, a dedicated group of Salem volunteers have picked up food donated by Chick-fil-A and delivered it to the Children's Home. These food donations are integral to helping the kitchen staff serve 160-180 meals daily to residents and staff. A new volunteer is needed to serve every other MONDAY morning at about 10-11 a.m. Training and freezer bags are provided.

The time commitment is usually no more than one hour. It involves loading and carrying 6-8 bags (max weight 15-20 lbs. each).



BOOK GROUP TO DISCUSS THE LINCOLN HIGHWAY

Everyone is welcome to Book Group discussions on the second Monday of each month (except December, July, and August) at 7:30 p.m. in the Katie Luther room. We are always interested in additional books to read. If you have a favorite please let us know by contacting guyddavisphd@gmail.com.

On February 13 we will discuss *The Lincoln Highway* by Amor Towles. In June, 1954, eighteen-year-old Emmett Watson is driven home to Nebraska by the warden of the juvenile work farm where he has just served fifteen months for involuntary manslaughter. His mother long gone, his father recently deceased, and the family farm foreclosed upon by the bank, Emmett's intention is to pick up his eight-year-old brother, Billy, and head to California where they can start their lives anew. But when the warden drives away, Emmett discovers that two friends from the work farm have hidden themselves in the trunk of the warden's car. Together, they have hatched an altogether different plan for Emmett's future, one that will take them all on a fateful journey in the opposite direction—to the City of New York.

Spanning just ten days and told from multiple points of view, Towles's third novel will satisfy fans of his multi-layered literary



styling while providing them an array of new and richly imagined settings, characters, and themes. "Once again, I was wowed by Towles's writing—especially because The Lincoln Highway is so different from A Gentleman in Moscow in terms of setting, plot, and themes. Towles is not a one-trick pony. Like all the best storytellers, he has range. He takes inspiration from famous hero's journeys, including The Iliad, The Odyssey, Hamlet, Huckleberry Finn, and Of Mice and Men. He seems to be saying that our personal journeys are never as linear or predictable as an interstate highway. But, he suggests, when something (or someone) tries to steer us off course, it is possible to take the wheel." – Bill Gates.

REFUGEE TASK FORCE UPDATE

Supper, Financial Support, New Housing, Employment



We are hoping to invite the congregation to a **Sunday Evening Supper** with the Durrani family and other refugee families we've sponsored in past years. It will be a covered dish supper for which we'd ask people to bring ethnic foods, such as we did for a much appreciated supper with the Dragadella and al Fahad families shortly before Covid. We know you will enjoy meeting the Durranis, and feel sure they'll be glad to meet you, too. We hope to find a suitable date in March or April.

This is a pivotal time in our sponsorship with the Durrani family. We are working to assist them now with new housing and employment, and have this month begun tapering our financial assistance (rent and utilities) with the intention to end by October. In the meantime we do again need your **financial donations** for these last nine months. Such support is to assure that they will be successful in their independence 18 months after their arrival in Catonsville. Use a pew envelope and mark it "Refugee Fund" or mail it to the church office with that designation.

We are now assisting the Durrani family in their search for a new apartment. They are seeking a **three-bedroom townhouse** or apartment so that Masooma's niece Sahra, who has recently come to the US, could live with them and share the expenses. Sahra is working full-time, and registered for driving school. Ideally we are hoping they could remain in the Catonsville High school zone where the three teens could have the advantage of the new ESOL program there. We know they may need to consider a neighboring school. They must move to their new home in March/April.

We are also appealing to the congregation for help with leads in finding **employment opportunities** for Masooma. She has been attending weekly English classes for some time now, and her English has improved since her arrival in the States, increasing her opportunities. As a single mom she wishes to work during the day in order to be home with her children for supper and the evening. Though she is beginning driving school, at present she needs work for which she can use public transportation from her apartment near the city line and Frederick Road.

Scripture clearly calls us to this ministry with the refugee, the stranger, the alien. We hear it in Moses' command, fresh from Mt. Sinai (Leviticus 19:34) and the voice of our Lord just days before his crucifixion (Matthew 25: 35). As we give thanks that this family is making their way in the security and freedom of this new land, please keep in your prayers the many millions of refugees still seeking safe haven the world over.


Doctor Dolittle is a stage musical with book, music and lyrics by Leslie Bricusse, based on the 1967 movie of the same name and the children's stories by Hugh

Her family was safe from the war in Syria, but they didn't have access to adequate food or basic medical care.

Through LWR, Walaa enrolled in a livelihoods program for refugees and received all the training and supplies she needed to start a business as a beekeeper. With the money she earned, she also planted a vegetable garden to help feed her family. Now she's earning enough to keep her family afloat, and she's even training other women how to produce and sell honey.
