## **ADULT FORUM SERIES**

Pastor Carolyn will be leading adult forum March 12, 19, and 26. All are welcome to join! There will be no adult forum on Palm Sunday or Easter Sunday.

March 12 & 19: The Rise and Fall of the House Church Movement—Women's Authority in the Early Christian Community

Our first two sessions are complimenting and expounding upon our previous adult forum series, 'The Women of the Bible Speak'. We will learn about the formation of early Christianity and the role that women played as missionaries, apostles, priests, and leaders in 'the church in their house'. We will also delve into the later development of the Christian household codes and their use in silencing women's authority in public worship and ecclesial leadership.

March 26: God's Image in the Hebrew Bible, New Testament, and Cloud of Witnesses

What ideas, metaphors, images, and language do we use to talk about God? How did the different writers of our sacred scripture imagine God, and what does that imply for us today? In this final session, we will delve into the image (and hiddenness) of God in the Holy Bible and Christian writings.



## **SUNDAY SCHOOL**

On February 12<sup>th</sup> the students did several Valentine's activities. One of the activities was making cards for shut-ins of Salem's Congregation. February 19<sup>th</sup> we learned about Abraham and Sarah and how they would have more descendants than the stars in the sky. Sharon Schueler taught the children about constellations. The children did two activities making their own constellations and making a constellation snack. On February 26<sup>th</sup> we learned about Ash Wednesday and Lent and the children will be working on acts of kindness for the weeks of Lent.

During March and the beginning of April, we will cover Jonah and the Big Fish, Queen Esther, Holy Week, and Palm Sunday. The students will finish by planting individual Easter Gardens.





#### GRADUATING IN 2023? YOU MIGHT BE ELIGIBLE FOR A SALEM SCHOLARSHIP!

Salem's high school seniors--and their families--have many concerns about post-high school plans at the beginning of the new year, not the least of which is the cost of higher education. Do keep in mind the ministry of Salem's Scholarship program, which for over 20 years has assisted Salem members as they undertake the next step in their academic preparation. Stipends of up to \$750 per year for a total of four years cover only a modest part of the total higher education bill but they can make an important difference.

Salem scholarships recognize accomplishment in any of the following categories: academic achievement; Christian character, service, and citizenship; educational and career goals; and financial need. They also take into account the differing ways in which students have applied their talents and interests, and recognize the variety of post-high school educational experiences that may be the best fit for students.

The deadline for 2023 applications is **April 15**. Salem's high school seniors will receive a personal letter inviting them to consider applying for the program but it's not too early to learn about the program.

A free will offering will be taken to support the work of the Baltimore Aftercare Program itself. Carolyn Vasold and her Committee hope you will plan to join them on the evening of March 12 to hear about both of these programs and give your support.

## **GUY'S EYES SEE THE WORLD**

The Agape Gallery current show presents photographs by Salem's own Guy Davis. He is showing photos from his travels that include many different places in the world that many of us may not ever see.

"I first became involved in photography in college developing black and white film. But my interest waned until the establishment of digital photography and post processing (digital developing). My technique and style matured with Tony Northrup's Stunning Digital several Great **Courses/National** Photography and Geographic videos on photography. My main focus in photography is landscapes and flora/fauna.




Unlike painters and similar artists who can create their own image of what they see, photographers are stuck with what nature provides. That is not to say that photographers are helpless. To obtain the best composition, they can move closer or farther, change location or perspective (angle), or wait for the ambient light to change. They can also change the image's depth of field to blur unwanted elements or use long exposures to highlight dim features or deliberately blur moving objects. Professional photographers on assignment can spend several days scouting a location to obtain one published photograph.

I rarely have that much time when I combine my interests in photography and traveling, but I try to keep an eye out for opportunities to shoot artistic scenes that go beyond snapshots. For example, on a boat ride on the Neva River in St. Petersburg, the setting sun was going behind the buildings on the shore. I timed my shot to catch the sun shining through the dome of the Peter and Paul Cathedral [Sunset at Peter and Paul Cathedral]. Other times, it helps to be lucky. On safari in Kruger National Park in South Africa we were making a short trip to a neighboring lodge, and our vehicle stopped so that we could take photographs of an elephant near the trail. As we had finished with that elephant, I heard rustling behind me on the other side of the vehicle. I instinctively turned and raised my camera with a wide-angle lens and snapped a photo of another elephant charging our vehicle [Charging Elephant] just before our driver slapped the door to startle the elephant and sped away. That's one that I would have missed if I tried to frame."

Thank you for your support of LVC fellowships. Your gift helped us continue the service experience at no cost to LVC fellows, with LVC covering the costs for housing, utilities, transportation, health insurance, programming, and administration. Because of your generosity:

- Sixteen LVC fellows were gifted the year-of-service experience in Washington DC, Baltimore MD, and Minneapolis MN; with virtual fellows serving from their hometowns.
- Fellowships included intentional community in LVC housing, year-long placements with nonprofit partners, and exploration of spirituality and LVC values.
- The service experience was provided at no cost to LVE fellows, and they received a modest monthly stipend.
- LVC continued monthly, national program days, bringing everyone together to take deeper dives into social
  justice topics like activism and voting rights; while learning to use a social justice lens to reimagine the
  possibilities.
- LVC's hike-a-thon was hosted in 10 cities around the country, led by alumni, churches, staff, and supporters; and raised approximately \$15,000.
- Several LVC alumni were hired by their Placements after their service year.

This letter includes a summary of your gifts for 2022. We appreciate your support, and hope to see you at a hike near you in May.

Thank you for your 2022 donation(s) to Baltimore Outreach Services. Your gift(s) totaling \$4941.49 provided housing and services to Baltimore City homeless women and their children.

We completed the calendar year, providing shelter and services to 126 individuals. One of only three shelters that provide for children, we served 74 children aged two months - to 17 yrs. (59% of the shelter's occupancy). Our case manager worked diligently to assist the families with housing applications and the necessary paperwork required for the process. In 2022, 12 families moved from BOS into permanent and transitional housing.

You are providing an urgently needed safe place to shelter during a crisis. Thank you for making it possible for women and children to receive shelter, programs, and services as they journey from homelessness to housing. Thank You, For all you do for families in the Shelter to navigate homelessness.


