SALEM CONGREGATIONAL MEETING SCHEDULED FOR MAY 6 AND MAY 7



On April 18, 2023, Salem's Church Council, upon the recommendation of the Call Committee, voted unanimously to recommend to the Salem Congregation that Pr. Carolyn Lawrence be called as Salem's Associate Pastor. Pr. Carolyn has been serving as Salem's Interim Assistant Pastor since September 2022. She graduated from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago in May 2022. A Congregational

Meeting will be held on May 6 and 7 at all three worship services, to vote on calling Pastor Carolyn as our Associate Pastor. The meeting begins after the 5p.m. service and continues before the two Sunday morning services. Every member household in the congregation has received a mailing announcing the meeting and providing more information regarding the terms of Pastor Carolyn's call and a biography for Pastor Carolyn. Please make every effort to attend worship and remember to come early for the Congregational Meeting.

THE CALL PROCESS FOR CALLING PASTOR CAROLYN LAWRENCE TO SERVE AS OUR ASSOCIATE PASTOR

In the summer of 2022, the Salem Church Council formed a Profile Committee led by Guy Davis. The Profile Committee surveyed the congregation for their input about what they would like to see in a new Associate Pastor and their thoughts about the strengths and weaknesses of the congregation. The survey clearly showed the congregation wanted an Associate Pastor who was young and who would lead the Youth Ministry. Also, a pastor who was a good preacher, who was not overtly "political" in their preaching, and who would support Pastor Dave in caring for the congregation. The profile was submitted to the Synod in September 2022. Then Salem also created a Call Committee led by Sharon Stanton. The Committee was comprised of 12 members representing the diversity of the congregation – young and old, newer member and older member, etc.

At about the same time the profile was submitted, the DE-MD Synod offered Salem the opportunity to hire (not call) Carolyn Lawrence to help provide assistance to Salem while we continued the Call Process. She was interviewed by Pastor Dave and then by the Salem Church Council and hired to work ¾ time for one year. At this juncture, the Salem Church Council decided to put the Call Process on hold sensing that perhaps Pastor Carolyn might be a good candidate for the Associate Pastor position. The Council decided that they would resume the process in the spring with the possibility of having a call vote after Easter.

The Call Committee met on March 11 and after deliberation decided to recommend to the Church Council that the Call Committee interview only Pastor Carolyn. This was determined by Pastor Dave's unqualified recommendation, the Committee's assessment that she fulfilled the expectations of what the congregation was looking for based on the responses to the profile survey, and her desire to lead the Salem Youth Ministry. The Committee felt it was a good fit. There was also the factor that, according to Synod guidelines, a first-call candidate does not compete against other candidates, meaning if we were to interview others then we could not have interviewed Pastor Carolyn. The recommendation was submitted to the Salem Church Council which approved it.

On April 15 the Call Committee formally interviewed Pastor Lawrence. Pastor Lawrence indicated that she and her spouse expect to move to the Arbutus/Halethorpe area this summer if called. As to her future plans she, at a minimum, would like to stay at Salem long enough to see the present confirmands graduate from high school but she has no plans for future ministry other than to be a parish pastor. The Committee is confident that Pastor Carolyn's excellent performance these past eight months will mean she will be a highly effective Associate Pastor for our congregation. The Committee voted to recommend Pastor Carolyn to the Salem Church Council. The Council interviewed Pastor Carolyn on April 18 and voted unanimously to recommend her to the congregation. Along with the Call Committee and Pastor Dave the Council believes Pastor Carolyn has the gifts to be an outstanding Associate Pastor, and highly recommend her to the Salem Congregation.







CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Project Linus provides handmade blankets to children 0-18 in the United States who are seriously ill, traumatized, or otherwise in need. We learned about Palm Sunday and how Jesus rode a donkey to Jerusalem. We participated in a donkey relay game riding our donkeys to Jerusalem. We ended the month reflecting on what happened during the week leading up to







Lutheran World Relief Quilt Dedication May 13 & 14

The storage area in Salem's attic is overflowing with the 150+ LWR quilts, sewn by Salem's Quilt Group in the last six months. Members have been hard at work, understanding the great need worldwide. In 2022, LWR distributed 220,000 quilts to people in 17 countries. As usual, quilts will be displayed in the sanctuary for the Saturday and Sunday services and will be packed into bags after the 11 o'clock service. On Monday morning, the quilts will be delivered by Quilt Group members to the LWR warehouse in New Windsor, where they will be prepared for shipment and loaded into containers.

The Quilt Group has welcomed several new members recently and hopes that others will participate. There are a number of ways to do this. The group meets every Wednesday morning at Salem from 10 a.m. to Noon. You do not need to have any sewing skills to participate, and you do not need to come to work



sessions on Wednesdays. members work at home cutting fabric into the 11" squares that make up the guilt tops. Others donate fabric, sheets, and blankets from their own households, or from finds at yard sales, thrift shops, or especially from the Treasure Sales at Charlestown. The group is funded in part by Thrivent Action Team Grants and is grateful for this support. Any Thrivent Member could assist the group by volunteering to submit grant applications. Any and all contributions to this valuable ministry help us respond to the message of Jesus when he told us "Love your neighbor yourself." SALEM'S MUSIC MINISTRY

Worship at Salem on Palm Sunday, during Holy Week, and on Easter has been especially enriched by the Senior Choir, led by Director of Music Mary Miller.

Palm Sunday at Salem began this holiest of weeks in the Christian Year with the presentation of "Come Walk with Me." This cantata, by contemporary composer Pepper Choplin, carried the congregation through the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem where he was to celebrate Passover with his disciples. The spoken text, combined with portions of the story told in song, brought the congregation to the arrest, crucifixion, and death of Jesus. At the conclusion of the cantata. the lifeless body of Jesus is removed from the cross. Numerous worshippers commented on how moving it was to be present on Palm Sunday.

The happy ending to the story was lifted up by the choir on Easter. Mary Miller turned to Handel's "Messiah" and chose the passage entitled "Worthy is the Lamb" for the anthem. As is the custom at Salem, the choir sang Handel's "Hallelujah Chorus" as the postlude with the congregation invited to sing along.

Mary Miller issues an open and ongoing invitation to all who would like to be a part of this special ministry. To make it easy and convenient, she holds two rehearsals each week, one on Sunday morning between services and another on Thursday evening at 6:30 pm. Not everyone can make a weekly commitment from September through June. She welcomes those that cannot participate every week. ELECTRONICS RECYCLED

Thanks to Salem members, 99 discarded electronic devices were recycled between January 1 and March 31, 2023. The devices are taken to the Catonsville Senior Center where they are combined with donations from other Senior Centers and shipped to a company that removes the rare earth elements for recycling. This not only provides a way for us to discard old devices and keep them out of landfills, but it reduces the need to mine for the rare elements. The Senior Center makes a small profit from this process, which is donated to the Baltimore County Department of Aging Holiday Program. This is a win-win project that will continue indefinitely. 


