This November 2024 marks our 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Salem is the oldest continuing congregation in Catonsville. Our first church building, in the 700 block of Ingleside Avenue, still stands and is lovingly cared for by Historical Old Salem, Inc. In 1903, the congregation built our present building which was added on to in 1954, and renovated in 1997.

Salem has had a long rich tradition of helping train seminarians for ordained ministry. As part of our ongoing celebration, we will be having a guest preacher most months who had served at Salem as a vicar or teaching parish student. We will also be inviting Pastor Amy Asendorf Berger and Pastor Daniel Collins to preach as they both were sent into ministry from this Salem congregation.


#### MEN'S PRAYER BREAKFAST



#### FINAL REFUGEE TASK FORCE UPDATE REGARDING THE DURRANI FAMILY

Close of Our Current Appeal for the Refugee Fund

At the meeting of the Refugee Task Force in early December, we agreed that the Durrani family has successfully achieved a satisfactory and commendable degree of independence such that we can consider our goals and responsibilities as their sponsor to be met. Therefore, we are no longer seeking donations for the Refugee Fund and will adjourn our activity for a year or two.

We welcomed them to their apartment, their new home and safe haven in the US on March 14, 2022. They have been financially independent since October, and have not needed to seek our counsel for legal, medical or Department of Human Services matters for several months. They are managing their own transportation. Masooma has been employed at Forest Haven Nursing Home for over a month now in the housekeeping department. Her niece Sahra began work there in September.

Rohail, Saba and Lima are doing well at Catonsville High, socially and academically, with many Honor Roll citations. Rohail has worked as a checker for several months at Giant Food on Rolling Road, sometimes as much as 36 hours a week (and still on the Honor Roll).

Mindful of the global intensity regarding Islamophobia and anti-Semitism since October 7, I asked Rohail about their experience at Catonsville High. He responded, "Everything is going so well in school. Yes, teachers and students are sad what is going on over there in Palestine and Gaza. We really haven't got any problem. Our school is so good and I like them very much."

All of them (and all of us) were relieved when they received their asylum cards and status about six weeks ago. We expect Rohail to earn his driver's license in April, and at that time will transfer to Masooma the title of the car donated for them.

We invite your continued prayers for the Durranis, and for refugees the world over. Now with nearly 1.5 million displaced persons in Gaza (80% of the population), the global challenge of assisting refugees and displaced persons is millions beyond record numbers.

#### FINAL REFUGEE TASK FORCE UPDATE REGARDING THE DURRANI FAMILY CONTINUED...

Though we are not appealing for Salem's Refugee Fund, massive monies are needed for these global challenges. Lutheran World Relief is sending quilts and health care supplies to Gaza, Ukraine and elsewhere. Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service resettles refugees in the US; currently they are also appealing for temporary foster parents for unaccompanied children at our southern border. LWR and LIRS are always worthy recipients of your charity.

These are 4 star charities deeply engaged on the ground in Gaza: American Near East Refugee Aid (ANERA), Palestine Children's Relief Fund (PCRF) and UNICEF. I encourage you to visit their websites and contribute as you're inspired and able.

This does not signal the end of our friendship with the Durranis, of course. This weekend several of us are excited to be attending Sahra's wedding. She'll soon after move to Ohio.

We are deeply grateful to all who assisted us in this sponsorship: all who offered prayers and contributed funds; those who donated furniture, household goods and food to stock their apartment two years ago; the volunteers who lent their hands and backs for moving day.

Along with others who've participated in the RTF across the last six years, I want to express my special gratitude to those who have throughout these past two years spent hours and hours providing transportation for groceries and doctors' appointments, helping with paperwork and appointments with the Department of Human Services and the US Citizenship & Immigration Services, overseeing the teens' schooling, assisting with ESOL classes, giving driving lessons, and so often providing friendship and advice: Beth Rodgers, Julia Graham, Debbie Brohawn, Brent Tolbert-Smith, Sara Toscano, Susan Gundlach, Laura Miller, Jeff Rasmussen, Dave Merriman and Billie Jo and Carl Kreps.

In Matthew's gospel, Mary and Joseph clasp tight their toddler and flee the violence descending on Bethlehem, escaping through Gaza into Egypt. It's an old story. And lamentably it's relived over and over down the centuries. In the last days before his death Jesus commanded his disciples to care for the stranger, and in doing so they will welcome our Lord himself. May God ever grace us to do this.



I was naked, and you gave me clothing; I was sick, and you took care of me; I was in prison, and you visited me. Matthew 25:36

Blessings and peace! Please accept my appreciation for your recent gift. We are thankful for your support, as we work to help individuals to become contributing members in society after a time of incarceration. Your help allows us to meet the immediate needs of released individuals (e.g., bus passes, clothing, and food) and to establish a spiritual mentoring relationship with them, as the rates for recidivism (return to prison) in both jails and prisons are high. The National Institute of Justice reports 44% of criminals released return the first year out of prison and 77% within five years; Maryland's 2022 three-year recidivism rate is 40.5%. While BAAP is still establishing its network of partnering organizations and has only established a handful of mentoring relationships, similar ministries in the United States have reported an overall 8% recidivism rate verses the national average of almost 77% for those who graduate a spiritual mentoring program.

Your support of the Community of Saint Dysmas is also important to us, as they help incarcerated individuals form a relationship with God and tell of our mentoring program. After their initial application, BAAP works to establish a mentoring relationship prior to their release between the individual and members of a house of worship in the area the person intends to live. After release, the mentors meet with the individual each week and help them in their faith walk and with other things (e.g., creating a resume or a budget).

BAAP was founded as Loudoun Aftercare Program (LAP) in 2007 in Northern Virginia but moved to the Baltimore area in 2017. With this move, we adjusted our approach, as incarcerated individuals in the Maryland Prison System are typically released directly to society, which is different than the approach in Virginia, where individuals in the state prison system are released to the local county jail. However, the Community of Saint Dysmas has been immensely helpful in getting us in contact with incarcerated individuals.

Your financial and prayerful support is appreciated. We look forward to working with you and the Community of Saint Dysmas.
