PASTOR DAVE TO RETIRE

It is with great sorrow and joy that Salem learned that Pr. Dave Asendorf announced his retirement effective June 30, 2025. Pr. Dave has been with Salem for nearly 20 years and will be sorely missed. He led us in ministry to Catonsville and the world, Saturday worship, ministry during the COVID pandemic, the introduction of live-streaming services, Salem's 175th Anniversary, *Salem The Musical*, and several long-range goals. Salem will miss his leadership, sermons, Bible Study, pastoral care, guidance, and friendship.

In addition to his contributions to Salem, Pr. Dave is also known for his involvement in the Catonsville community and Delaware-Maryland Synod. These activities include serving on the Board of the Catonsville Emergency Assistance, Chair of the Delaware-Maryland Synod's Candidacy Committee, the Catonsville Ministerium (a fellowship of Catonsville clergy), Co-chair of the Synod's Malaria Campaign, the Board of the Lutheran Campus Ministry in College Park, and the Synod's *Forward in Faith* campaign team. As a result of Pastor Dave's stewardship in both the church and local community, he was presented with the prestigious ELCA Peterman Award in 2019.

Pastor Carolyn will continue to serve in her current capacity as Associate Pastor as Salem searches with the assistance of the Synod for a new Senior Pastor. She has decided not to seek the position of Senior Pastor as she continues in her ministry to Salem and leads the Youth Program.

Having packed up 305 handmade hats and scarves and sent them on their way to seafarers visiting the Port of Baltimore, the Stitchcrafters found themselves looking for a new challenge.

And so, with nine weeks before the holidays and a surplus of red yarn, members heeded the call to make hats for the Westside Men's Emergency Shelter. On the grounds of Spring Grove in Catonsville, this facility typically welcomes 150 people on any given night.

Many sets of hands began knitting and crocheting hats, including several members of the Salem congregation who were inspired by the project to participate from home.

And so, on Thursday, December 19, a group gathered in Bethany Hall to attach candy canes to the hats and pack them up in large, decorated boxes. The final total: 216 hats.

Blessed by Pastor Carolyn, the hats were delivered to the Shelter later in the day. All agree that this outreach project belongs on the calendar for 2025.

A reminder that the Stitchcrafters meet almost every Thursday from 10 a.m. to noon in the Wittenberg Room. Yarn and needles/hooks are supplied, as well as project help and caring support. All are welcome!

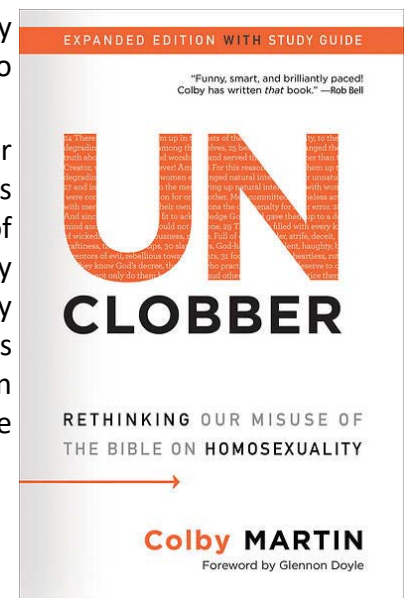

ADULT FORUM

Adult Forum kicked off a seven-week study of the book *UnClobber* by Colby Martin on Sunday, 12 January 2025, but there is still time to catch up or to drop in for a session and participate in the discussion.

Armed with only six passages in the Bible—often known as the "Clobber Passages"—the conservative Christian position has been one that stands against the full inclusion of our LGBTQ siblings. *UnClobber* reexamines each of those frequently quoted passages of Scripture, alternating with author Colby Martin's own story of being fired from an evangelical megachurch when they discovered his stance on sexuality. *UnClobber* reexamines what the Bible says (and does not say) about homosexuality in such a way that sheds light on outdated and inaccurate assumptions and interpretations. 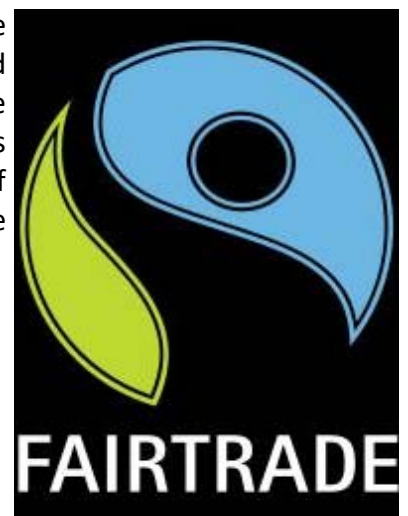
